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Application Process

- Interested applicants should turn applications for placement in to the Uganda Cancer Institute research and training directorate at least three months prior to the placement date together with an updated CV and 2 letters of recommendations from their academic institutions (departmental heads).
- Applications will be reviewed by the research and training directorate in the first week of every month and feedback provided within two weeks from then.
- Availability of a placement opportunity will depend on relevance of the student's objectives to the UCI mission and goals (see Appendix A), availability of a supervisor to mentor the student and other resources at the UCI
- Minimum duration of the training/placement is 2 weeks. Students who wish to come to the Uganda Cancer Institute for less than 2 weeks will be considered visitors and are advised to channel their requests through the Directors office
- An administrative fee of \$200 per month of rotation will be charged

Additional requirements for selected candidates

- 1. Selected applicants should have evidence of required travel vaccinations including:
 - Hepatitis B, Meningitis, Rabies, Hepatitis A, Typhoid, Yellow Fever, Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR), Diphtheria-Tetanus-pertussis (dtap), Varicella (Chicken Pox), Polio, Flu shot.
 - Antimalarial prophylaxis
 - Applicants should also check with their centre for disease control for travel requirements to Uganda.
- 2. Qualified medical professionals who would like a hands on experience should;
 - Contact the Uganda Ministry of Health relevant body for registration i.e. The Medical and Dental Practioners Association for Doctors or Nurses and Midwives council for Nurses.
 - Avail proof of registration (bring original copy on arrival) and current practicing license from regulatory body in their country of origin.
